The board of county commissioners met yesterday in their regular April session with all members present. During the forenoon the board was engaged in routine business. In the afternoon it was engaged in opening and considering bids.

For the blank books, stationery and office supplies there were two bids filed by Perkins Bros. Co. and Jos. B. Gossage. Action was deferred on awarding the contract.

For county printing two bids were received, one from Art W. Gird and one from Jos. B. Gossage. Action was deferred on the contract.

For the wood contract four bids were filed, as follows: Louis Volin, \$4.85 per cord; W. J. Snavely, \$4.65; F. F. Joy, \$5.20; A. L. Collins, \$5.24. Contract was awarded to W. J. Snavely.

For county physician four bids were filed, as follows: P. J. Waldron, \$231.00 cash per year; J. Van Buskirk, \$300.00 per year in county warrants; F. G. Gilbert, \$500.00 per year in cash; W. C.

At the government Indian school at Rapid City, Tuesday, April 2, 1901, Mabel Holy, of Bright's disease, aged eighteen years.

Miss Holy was from the Cheyenne River agency and was the step-daughter of a chief named Touch-the-Cloud. She had been declining for some time and Superintendent Davis had written her parents sometime ago of her condition, but the distance from postal communication probably hindered their receiving intelligence of her condition in time to visit her. Rev. M. D. Collins attended the funeral and all the students marched to the cemetery and paid their last respects to their schoolmate in a beautiful manner under the conduct of Superintendent Davis and his wife.

INSTRUCTIONS TO TEACHERS.—The principal of each school must fill this blank in duplicate, and sign the "Teacher's Certificate" on the back of this report. During vacation or temporary suspension of a school, reports must be made stating the fact. July and August being vacation months in most of the schools, the average attendance for the month of *September* is regarded as the average attendance of the entire first quarter. The report for the quarter ending *September 30* should give the number of pupils who remained at the school during the vacation period, on separate sheet No. 5-251 b, so that the record will agree with accounts papers in the matter of issuing rations to pupils. Of course, it must be understood that rations will be issued only to the exact number of pupils in daily attendance as shown upon this report.

INSTRUCTIONS TO AGENTS.—The Agent must examine this report, and fill up and sign the "Agent's Certificate," and forward **one** copy to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.
